Alpha Chi Regional Presidents-Vice Presidents Elected

For Immediate Release: Weds., Apr. 1, 2026

LITTLE ROCK, Ark.—Affirming Alpha Chi’s commitment to shared governance, voting delegates from its seven geographic regions elected their presidents and vice presidents during the 2026 Alpha Chi National Convention in Orlando, Florida, March 12-14. Regional presidents and vice presidents serve two-year terms.

Dr. Rebekah Crowe, chapter advisor for the chapter of Alpha Chi at Wayland Baptist University was elected to serve in the position of Region I President. The vice presidency went unfilled, and plans were made to hold a virtual election by year’s end.

Dr. Enrique Colón, Harding University chapter advisor, was elected Region II President, and faculty advisor **Dr. Jennifer Hicks of Southeastern Oklahoma State University** was approved to continue her role as Region II Vice President.

Elected as Region III President was **Dr. Gilbert Eyabi, Anderson University (SC)** advisor, and **Dr. Diep Ca of Shenandoah University** will serve as Region III Vice President.

Dr. Steve Hoekstra of Kansas Wesleyan University was elected by Region IV delegates as its president, and his Kansas Wesleyan co-advisor, **Dr. Tonia Compton**, was elected to serve as vice president.

As neighboring regions, delegates from V and VI met together and agreed to combine their leadership teams, informally creating Region V-VI. Together they elected as president, **Dr. Tanner Babb, chapter advisor at Huntington University**. To serve as the region’s vice president, **Dr. Joni Lindsey of Lake Superior State University** was elected.

Region VII delegates elected **Dr. Pamela Johnston of Fresno Pacific University** to serve as their president, and **Grand Canyon University’s chapter advisor, Anya Cofrancesco**, will serve as Region VII Vice President.
